

These two logos are to be combined. I have highlighted elements of each logo to use in the final image. The final layout follows the top image. The bottom image is used only as single element details.

Use the provided color pallet.

I will need the raw layout file(s) along with the font files. Keep the layers active so I can make adjustments if needed in the future. Adobe Photoshop files. Payment requires these files. Final form has a transparent background



The image is very reflective around the vertical centerline. Try to make the final logo less obvious.

Use this sky detail. Shape may change a bit due to new sizing—see bottom image note about spacing.

Delete small cabin

Move larger cabin right to 2/3 placement from left edge.

Remove two black dots


Red 'Liberty' - Yes to gradient. #B93120 to #1F061E Use a similar font and need 'L and Y' to be pronounced as in left logo sample.

Black 'Land Traders' - solid color #1F061E

Insert lean thin black scroll detail

Keep gold and black outer edging.

Keep field and tree design. Trees may need to change size so that the cabin and proportions work.



Use the mountain detail from this image. Use the purple colors as well. See color pallet for purple family. Note the increased height between the top of the mountains and the outer boarder. Also increase the same space in the new logo. The three defined mountain peaks help break the vertical centerline issue as stated above.

You can vary from the supplied purple color pallet as needed but keep the colors warm.

Note how some trees rise above the mountain into the sky line; do this—maybe.
